Dear Parent / Guardian.

I have been teaching children to play the clarinet and saxophone at Pyrford Primary School for the last 15 years, with 100% success rate in Associated Board music exams, most children achieving Grades 1 - 5 standard before leaving for secondary school.

I ran the school orchestra for many years, and currently play sax in the worship band and lead the youth band at the Church of the Good Shepherd.
