

with this beautiful drawing using shape and colour to great effect. Wonderful work Charlie!






#### **HOCKEY**

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION RE FREE SCHOOL MEALS

From 1 April 2025, the Government's transitional protection arrangements for means tested Free School Meals (FSM) will end.

Any eligible claims confirmed from this date will no longer be protected. This means any child confirmed as eligible for free school meals from 1 April 2025 will be subject to ongoing checks to confirm continued eligibility. This will not impact any children who are already confirmed as eligible.

If you think you may be eligible for free school meals, even if your child is still in Squirrels or KS1 please contact the school office re this as only applications processed before 1<sup>st</sup> April 2025 will maintain transitional protection.

#### **Gardening Club - Call for Parent Helpers**

For the last few years the school has run an after school gardening club for children in the current Year 4 and Year 5. This has been organised and run by parents, but unfortunately this year changes in circumstances mean that we need one more parent volunteer to make the club viable - two extra volunteers would be ideal.

#### Parent and carer support

Supporting children who face additional challenges can be difficult at times. With that in Building futures mind, the Hope Service has created a space for groups of parents and carers to come Transforming lives together on a regular (fortnightly) basis to discuss the challenges they face in a confidential and supportive environment.

These groups are specifically for parents and carers of children who would like additional support. You will have an opportunity to exchange experiences and receive support towards managing the often complex situations you find yourselves in. This is not a parenting class, rather a non-judgemental support group and we encourage you to talk about whatever seems most important.

The Hope Service will be offering topical sessions to coincide with the dates on offer, where parents and carers can join together to discuss current difficulties.

Support is offered via Microsoft Teams by Hope staff members, which could include a Therapist, Nurse, Teacher, Social Worker and Hope day programme staff or outside facilitators.
