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Headteacher's Letter

Dear Parents,

It's hard to believe how quickly time has flown! It feels like just a few weeks ago that I arrived, and yet here we are, already approaching half-term. As this will be the final newsletter before the break, I wanted to take a moment to thank each of you for your warm welcome and support.

Next week, I'm holding informal drop-in sessions on **Thursday, 24th October**, where you can come along to meet me in person. Here are the session details:

- 8:30 AM School Hall: Drop-in after the morning drop-off.
- 2:30 PM Practical Room: Enter via the alleyway gate near Pine Class (before collecting children at 3:15 PM).
- 6:00 PM School Hall: Entry through the hall door.

There's no agenda for these sessions—just a chance for you to say hello, ask any questions, or share any thoughts over a cup of tea or coffee. I'd love to see you there!

This week, I had the pleasure of visiting all the classrooms during a Maths learning walk alongside our Maths leader. It was fantastic to witness such high-quality teaching and learning across the school. The children were so engaged, focused, and demonstrated excellent learning behaviours—exactly what we aim for.

It's also been a busy week on the sports front! Our Year 6 Netball team participated in a tournament, and a Hockey team travelled to Charterhouse School —everyone had a great time! Additionally, our Year 3 students had an exciting trip to Butser Farm as part of their learning journey, returning with plenty of new knowledge and enthusiasm.

In assembly this week, we continued our exploration of the 'Be-at-titudes' from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, focusing on justice and fairness. We reflected on how certain groups around the world face discrimination because of their religion, race, or beliefs. The children considered how they might feel if they were barred from attending school or forced to leave their homes due to persecution. We also linked this discussion to our school value of **respect**, emphasising the importance of respecting one another, our teachers, and our wider community.

As the evenings grow darker, I'd like to remind parents to explore the resources available on the **Clever Never Goes** website (<u>https://clevernevergoes.org/</u>). It's a valuable tool to help you talk with your children—especially older, more independent ones—about staying safe when travelling between school and home.

This also ties in with my ongoing reminders about **safe parking and walking**. Please remember that parking on white zig-zag lines, or in areas with two parallel yellow lines, is strictly prohibited as it endangers the entire school community. Additionally, please encourage your children to use the designated pathways around the school, rather than cutting through the car parks. Children often learn through imitation, so it's vital we model safe behaviours for them to follow.

Next week will end on a high note, with our Year 5 students visiting the Planetarium and the Year 5/6 Girls' football tournament. After that, the children will enjoy a well-deserved break for half-term.


