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Headteacher's Letter

Dear Parents,

It was lovely to welcome everyone back to school this week after the half-term break. I hope you all managed to take some time to rest and enjoy the holiday. As we move further into spring, we can look forward to more bright and glorious mornings like today!

This week, our Monday assembly continued the theme of King David and his teachings through the Psalms, with a focus on Psalm 27. We reflected on special places, explored God's beauty in the world around us, and considered how we can keep God at the centre of our lives by making good choices. Next week, alongside our current assembly theme, we have been invited to take part in an **Ash Wednesday** service at the church. This marks the beginning of the most significant period in the Christian calendar, leading up to Easter. During the service, any children or adults who choose to participate will have the opportunity to be **ashed**—the practice of making the sign of the cross on the forehead using ashes from palm leaves mixed with olive oil. This service is for children only, but adults are welcome to attend other Ash Wednesday services running that day if they wish to take part.

I hope your household has been abuzz with talk of the exciting changes in the lunch hall this week! The children's enthusiasm for the **dessert station** and **salad area** has been wonderful to see, and we've been delighted by the improvements in food quality, portion sizes, and engagement from the whole team. Finally, I'd like to remind all parents of the importance of ensuring children attend school every day. 
5 CHERRY - Hibba Bhatti and Isaac Hutchinson for their fantastic sketches and descriptions of the setting in our

The old cathedral was wretched and dilapidated. As Zoe looked at the once beautiful building, a slight fear crept inside her. Hibba







Parent and carer support



Supporting children who face additional challenges can be difficult at times. With that in mind, the Hope Service has created a space for groups of parents and carers to come together on a regular (fortnightly) basis to discuss the challenges they face in a confidential and supportive environment.

Building futures Transforming lives

Transforming lives These groups are specifically for parents and carers of children who would like additional support. You will have an opportunity to exchange experiences and

receive support towards managing the often complex situations you find yourselves in. This is not a parenting class, rather a non-judgemental support group and we encourage you to talk about whatever seems most important.

The Hope Service will be offering topical sessions to coincide with the dates on offer, where parents and carers can join together to discuss current difficulties.

Support is offered via Microsoft Teams by Hope staff members, which could include a Therapist, Nurse, Teacher, Social Worker and Hope day programme staff or outside facilitators.


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
